Government Shutdown

It is truly unfortunate that the federal government created an environment within our country that places many families into a difficult financial situation. Should any York Academy family be employed in a federal job and is not working or being paid for the work performed, I strongly suggest submitting an application for free or reduced priced meals for York Academy children.

The staff will process that application quickly and hopefully be able to provide some assistance during the government shutdown. The application for Free or Reduced Lunch can be secured from the Main Office of either school.

Handicapped Parking at the York Academy Lower School

Please be aware that the City of York moved the designated space for handicapped parking to the front of the building on North Street. Those displaying handicapped parking permits should use the North Street space rather than the previously designated area on Beaver Street.

Be reminded that Parking Enforcement Officers will ticket individuals parking or dropping off students on Beaver Street. The York Academy provides a safe procedure for dropping off students by using the rear parking lot of the Lower School.

Security for Parent Pick-up

The York Academy Staff takes the security of our students seriously. During dismissal, our staff is instructed to not allow a student to be dismissed to a person that does not appear on the child's Emergency Card. Therefore, if parents are designating a non-parent to pick-up the child, the name of that person must appear on the Emergency Card. Parents may update information on the Emergency Card by visiting the Main Office or updating the demographic information through the <u>Parent Portal</u> (Sapphire).

The buses would be parked in

empty lots or fields. Families in need, especially those with infants or young children, would be offered space first. Neva hopes that local businesses would support the project financially or by donating materials.


In her words, "This project is important to me because everyone deserves to have a home. These buses aren't a permanent solution to homelessness, but they can be a stepping stone to a permanent future."

Safe2Say Something (S2SS)

The York Academy is committed to assuring the safety of children while in our care. We are also concerned about the safety of our entire staff and continue to evaluate the operation of our schools to address safety concerns.

The York Academy is pleased to announce that our school will be participating in the <u>Safe2Say Something</u> program initiated through the Attorney General's Office as a requirement of Act 44. The program is designed to teach students, teachers, classified staff and administrators how to recognize warning signs and signals - especially within social media - of individuals that may be a threat to themselves or others and <u>Say Something</u> to a trusted adult or use the anonymous reporting system. The program teaches participants to:

• Recognize the signs and signals of at-risk behaviors – especially within social media



- Report it anonymously through the Safe2Say Office of the Attorney General's 24/7 Crisis Center, mobile app or website
- · Respond to and manage the submitted tip via a school-based educator and administrator team

Students are usually aware of the problems their peers experience at home or at school, and schools need to assure that students are aware of danger signs and provide them with the tools necessary to assist a peer work through a problem. Our students are heavily involved with social media and there is significant sharing of information on these apps. Our students need to be able to identify issues on social media. S2SS teaches students what to look for in text, video and photos while empowering them to act quickly to help a fellow student.

The S2SS program is being provided through Sandy Hook Promise (SHP), a nation-wide non-profit organization. SHP programs are available in all 50 states with millions of students and parents trained. The program is designed for students in middle and high schools. The York Academy staff will be training all students in grades six through nine in the next several weeks.

Selecting the New Chief Executive Officer

The Board of Trustees reviewed over 20 applications for the position of the York Academy's Chief Executive Officer. After interviewing six well qualified candidates, the Board further narrowed the field to two candidates. They are Ms. Angela Sugarek and Dr. Michael Lowe.

Ms. Angela Sugarek

Ms. Sugarek is currently the principal of the James Hogg Middle School in Houston, Texas. The school in which Ms. Sugarek is the principal is an International Baccalaureate School serving 950 students. Previously, Ms. Sugarek was the principal of Durham Elementary School, Houston, Texas, Dean of Instruction at McReynolds Middle School, and a Data Analyst with the Houston Independent School District.

Ms. Sugarek earned a Bachelor of Science degree in History and Mathematics from the Eastern New Mexico University and a Master of Educational Administration from the University of Texas at Austin.

Dr. Michael Lowe

Dr. Lowe is currently the Head of the York Academy Upper School. The Upper School offers the Middle Years Programme to 130 student in grades eight and nine. Prior to his current role, Dr. Lowe was the Supervisor of Instructional Development for the York Academy. In addition, his previous assignments include Assistant Superintendent at the School District of Cheltenham, Supervisor of Elementary Education at the Red Lion Area School District, and Principal for the School District of the City of York.

Dr. Lowe earned a Bachelor of Arts in Speech Communication from Shippensburg University, Master of Science in Counseling from Shippensburg University, Doctorate in Educational Leadership from Duquesne University and a Certificate of Advanced Educational Leadership from Harvard University.

The Board of Trustees extended an invitation to over 100 of our York Academy stakeholders to meet with Ms. Sugarek on February 6 and Dr. Lowe on February 7. Both candidates will have 30 minutes to share their educational background, employment history and vision for the York Academy. Following the presentation, the Board of Trustees will present several questions for the candidates to address.
